I have sold your cotton that we
had out The bale weighed 555
and I sold it at 6 cts \$33.30
and after the ginning and bagging
and ties come off there was
\$30.20. I paid Bassist \$25.00
and I paid Dolly \$5.20 we
still owe her \$1.55 She picked
1761 lbs at 40 cts per hundred
making \$7.05. Write and let
me hear from you H. M. Mobley.

After so long
a time I will write you a
few lines to let you know
that we are all tolerably well
hoping you are enjoying the
best of health. Joe had been
sick before you wrote to us
but was up again when you
wrote. He was in bed one
week. Mary Ann, as you

You know she has spells with
her left hip and leg that
she can hardly walk her
left foot and toes has got

to twirling her. Her toes
gets numb and she has to rub
them before she can move
them.

We have had an abundance
of rain this month. Write to

you can.
