

Friday A.M. 1890  
Dear Harder Lucy & Sam.

Guess I had better write you a  
note & let you know we got  
your letter with forms to fill  
out & also the quilt blocks.

We were very glad to hear from  
you. I to hear of the good rains  
you have been having, good way.  
I hope they will continue on till  
at least mid summer and make  
you folks can get a head a bit.

This Country has had some rain  
this year but it has been dry  
so long it will take a lot more  
to show it. Very much Barnhart  
60 miles from here is the driest  
ever. The last rain they had was  
a gully washer & did not do  
much good, however that Coun-  
try is near enough the oil

fields that their lease helps  
them out. We were planning on  
being on our way by the middle  
of next week but your Auntie  
has been up and down with a  
Cold & has good days & bad days  
so we wont start out till she  
feels better. she hasnt had any  
temp. for a few days so hope  
she will soon feel better.

Don (Jo's Boy) has been dragging  
around with a Cough for over a  
month so he went to their Dr.  
yesterday so the Dr. put him  
to bed in hospital to check  
on him for at least 5 days.

we hope the hail & Tornadoes  
have not hit you there as they  
have in other places over the  
state. Wife said tell you we  
are glad to get the quilt blocks  
from the entire family and

glad Bullet has grown up so he  
can go out side to paddle, but I  
bet Linda is out side with him  
most of the time; we think it  
very cute to add his name to  
the family on the quilt block.  
Herace I have filled out your  
birth Certificat except your  
Dads Middle Name I had  
forgoten that I may have your  
Mathers 1 year too old but that  
will not hinder the filing but  
I would add your Dads middle  
name, I get Mr. Condra, Mrs.  
Allen or Mrs. Branton to sign  
affidavit before some official  
you may know them.

mation I needed to fill your

No. list of the questions to be  
answered so I filled in all I
